

Contemplation Corner

You are the Light of the World...



We can grow our faith in this season of Great Lent and become beacons of love and hope. In the gospel of Matthew, chapter 5, verses 14 to 15, it is written: "You are the light of the world. A city set on a mountain cannot be hidden. Nor do they light a lamp and then put it under a bushel basket; it is set on a lampstand, where it gives light to all in the house" (Mt. 5:14, NABRE). If you are

hesitant to go deeper in prayer or to be more active in your religious communities, reflect on why that is.

Guiding Questions:

What can the journey of the saints teach me?

Do I want to be more active in my religious community? Why?

How can I use my talents to spread the light of God?

What healing do I seek during this season of Great Lent?

Saint Rafqa, the Lebanese Nun



Feast Day: March 23

Saint Rafqa was born on June 29, 1832, in Himlaya, a village in Northern Metn District in Lebanon. She was the only child of Saqer El- Shabq and Rafqa Gemayl. On July 7th, 1832, she was baptized and given the name Boutrossieh. Her parents taught her to love God and pray daily. At the age of seven, she suffered her first great loss with the death of her mother....

In 1899, she lost sight in her left eye and became paralyzed. Although she was blind and paralyzed, she kept smiling and thanking God for His grace of letting




