



Saint Maron



Feast Day: February 9th

Saint Maron, the hermit, lived in the second half of the 4th century A.D. (350-410) on "Mount Nabo" in a region called "Cyrrhus", situated between Antioch and Aleppo. He opted for life in the open air, day and night, in summer and in winter. He relinquished everything, living a life full of sacrifices, fasting, and prayer. Abstract: St. Ephrem, who was proclaimed a Doctor of the Church by Pope Benedict XV, and Jacob of Serugh were two of the earliest and most important representatives of the theological world-view of the Syriac church. In Early Syriac Theology, Chorbishop Seely Joseph Beggiani strives to present their insights in a systematic form according to headings used in western treatises, while not undermining the originality and cohesiveness of their thought.


