## **Contemplation Corner**

A Heart Like No Other | By Fr. Joe Daccache, Ed.D.




The Sacred Heart of Jesus is not just a physical organ, but a spiritual reality that expresses the core of Christ's person, personality, words, deeds, and mission. This is indeed what the Catechism of the Catholic Church points out when it quotes Pope Pius XII's encyclical Haurietis Aquas (1956) through these words: "The Sacred Heart of Jesus, pierced by our sins and for our salvation, 'is quite rightly considered the chief sign and symbol of that... love with which the divine Redeemer continually loves the eternal Father and all human beings' without exception" (No.478)

It is this Heart that loved us so much that he humbly "emptied himself taking the form of a slave, coming in human likeness" (Phil 2.7). It is this Heart that loved us so much that he meekly "went to the Jordan River to be baptized by John" in order to "fulfill all righteousness" (Mt 3, 13). It is this great Heart that loved us so much that he ultimately "laid down his life" for us, his friends, on the cross (Jn 15,13). It is this Heart that loved us so much that, once pierced, he became the "original source" of our life and our love (blood and water), a fountain of Mercy from which "flows the love of God" that pours into our lives (Benedict XVI, Deus Caritas, 7). It is this same Heart that continues to love us in the Eucharist, where he offers himself as our food and drink. It is this same Heart of Jesus that invites us to enter into a personal relationship with him, to know him, to trust him, to follow him, to learn from him, and to imitate him...so we could "find rest for our souls" (Mt 11:29). Henceforth, his "joy may be in [us] and [our] joy may be complete" (Jn 15:11) because after all, as Pope Francis affirms in Evangelii Gaudium: "Our Christian joy drinks of the wellspring of his [Jesus'] brimming heart" (5).

O Sacred Heart of Jesus, I adore you, I love you, and I consecrate myself to you. I offer you my heart still so hard and impenitent. Deign to wound it and bind it with the sweet bonds of your love, so my daily mantra (sacred prayer continuously repeated) would be "Jesus, meek and humble of heart, make my heart like unto Thine." I ask this, because Your heart, O Jesus, is like no other. Amen.



Saint Sharbel, the Lebanese Maronite Monk

Feast Day: Third Sunday of July

Saint Sharbel Makhlouf was born in Bekaa Kafra on May 8, 1828. Bekaa Kafra is a small mountain village, the highest in Lebanon and the Middle East, 5118 feet (1560 meters) above sea level, in the region of Bsharri (North Lebanon). In its vicinity are the ancient Cedars of Lebanon, called by the Lebanese, "the Cedars of the Lord."

Bekaa Kafra overlooks the valley of Qadeesha, where Sharbel had two uncles living as monks in the monastery of Saint Anthony of Kozhayah. They were a source of inspiration and models for him.




