

The Power of Penance, Resurrection, and Divine Mercy...



Indeed, if, while we were enemies, we were reconciled to God through the death of his Son, how much more, once reconciled, will we be saved by his life. Not only that, but we also boast of God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have now received reconciliation. (Rom. 5:10-11 USCCB)

Above is an excerpt of a passage from Saint Paul's letter to the Romans as he speaks on Faith, Hope, and Love. As we prepare to conclude this season of Great Lent, let us remember the sacrament of **Penance** available to us to greet the Glorious Resurrection with an honest heart that is open to God.

From **Penance** or reconciliation, comes **New Life** and Jesus Christ shows us this salvation by overcoming death on the cross. He died for the sins of the world and Saint Paul reminds us of how we have been saved.

This leads to the ultimate act of love and is a prime example of **Divine Mercy**. The Spiritual Design above illustrates a prayer in the Maronite Liturgy that reminds us of the unconditional love God gives us and to not be ashamed of the sins we have committed for there is always a path to salvation. There is always a way back to the Father's house.



Saint Mark the Evangelist

Feast Day: April 25

Saint Mark was the son of a Christian named Mary, whose home in Jerusalem became the place of gathering for Christians (Acts 12:12). Jesus celebrated the Last Supper at Mark's house. He was also a relative of Barnabas, the Cypriot Levite....

He traveled from Jerusalem to Antioch, with Paul and Barnabas, in order to preach the Gospel.... He transcribed the preaching of Peter at Rome into Greek around the year 65. Saint Peter made him bishop of Byblos, Lebanon where there is a large church in his honor... The various accounts of his life agree that he was martyred in Alexandria on Easter day around the year 70. May his prayers be with us.




