

How was your Lent? Remember getting your ashes way back on February 20th? The Feast of Pentecost brings Ash Monday and the entire 90-day Lent-Resurrection cycle to its fulfillment today. And what did the Son of God accomplish by going to the cross and conquering death in His Resurrection, and finally sending the Holy Spirit upon us? He accomplished a perfect sigh of love.

As Archbishop Fulton Sheen, mentions in a commentary: from all eternity the Father looks at the Son and the Son looks at the Father. What each sees is utter perfection and beauty. Each sighs his love for the other, and this shared breath is the Holy Spirit, love breathed back and forth between Father and Son. The Holy Spirit is a sigh of love, born of beauty.

Pentecost draws us into the perfect love between the Father and the Son. Their sigh of love fills the world: "a driving wind" fills the house in which the apostles were. They begin to speak with this same breath, speaking only one word: "Jesus." Jesus is my all in all, as Mother Teresa put it. "Only by the Holy Spirit," St. Paul testifies, "can anyone say that Jesus is Lord." Only by the Holy Spirit do we even know that we have a Savior, one who can purify our hobbled human love.

May 20 - Celebration of the Birthday of Saint Sharbel




After the Holy Mass, a first-class relic of Saint Sharbel was made available for veneration.

Saint Spotlight

Saint Aquilina of Byblos, Martyr

Feast Day: June 13

Saint Aquilina of Byblos (Jbeil) was born at the end of the 3rd century. She received her catechism from Ethalius, Bishop of Byblos. Her heart was inflamed with the love of Jesus Christ, and she spread her faith with fervor in Byblos and its surroundings. At age twelve, St. Aquilina began an endeavor to spread Christianity through her example and teaching.

Due to her teaching, many of the pagans were baptized, especially young people. She endured endless torture under the rule of Emperor Diocletian and her presumably deceased body was thrown outside of the city walls. With the help of an angel, St. Aquilina regained her consciousness and went before the magistrate who was astonished. She was imprisoned yet again and passed the next day. Her holy relics were later transported to Constantinople. (*Text adapted from The Maronite Synaxarion*)




