Montini (the future Pope Paul VI) once commented, "There is no more difficult work in the Church than to make a monastic foundation, exposed as it is to the spiritual opposition of the evil spirits as well as to innumerable obstacles in the domain of temporalities." † Truly we have much cause for gratitude!

#### 8 September 1978




Fr. William Driscoll begins a new order focused on Eucharistic Adoration under Cardinal Medeiros of Boston.

#### 1 October 1993




Our first foundation attempted in Bethlehem, South Dakota.

# 29 April 1996




Fr. William Driscoll consecrated abbot by Archbishop Zayek.
